What Are Sibshops?

Sibshops are a nationally acclaimed program that provides peer support within a recreational environment. It's designed to celebrate the many contributions made by brothers and sisters of kids with special needs! Each Sibshop encourages kids to participate in activities that encourage sharing, laughter and fun! Kids will have the chance to meet other kids whose brothers and sisters have special needs and talk about their experiences.



When Are Sibshops Held?

Sibshops are held 4 to 5 times a year for siblings ages 6+.

What Are the Costs?

The cost is \$15 per child, per Sibshop and \$5 for each additional child from that family.

Why Go To A Sibshop?

Sibshops are lively, relaxed events that combine recreation, information, and discussion, and give siblings the opportunity to celebrate the contributions and the challenges of their brothers and sisters with others who "get it."

They will meet other sibs, have fun, laugh, talk about the good and not-so-good parts of having a sib with special needs, play some great games, learn something about the services their brothers and sister receive, and have lots of fun.

Sibshops are guided by facilitators who have a passion for helping families and include professionals who work in various Family Services.

What Sibs Have Done With Sibshops
